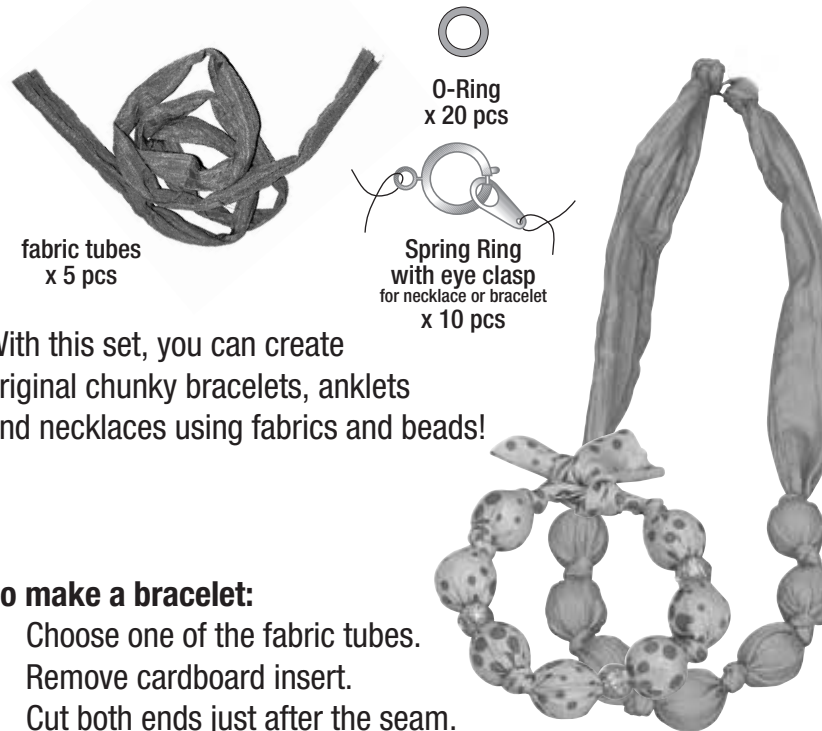

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LIST OF MATERIALS



With this set, you can create original chunky bracelets, anklets and necklaces using fabrics and beads!

To make a bracelet:

- Choose one of the fabric tubes.
- Remove cardboard insert.
- Cut both ends just after the seam.
- Decide if you want your bracelet to close with a clasp or a knot. If you want to use a clasp read the directions "To attach a clasp".

For a bracelet or anklet without a clasp

- Make a knot 2 ½" (6 cm) from one end of the fabric tube.
- Slide a pink or blue bead into the open end of the tube and slide it all the way down to the knot.
- Pull the fabric tight over the bead and twist once. Make a tight knot after the bead.
- Continue adding beads and making knots until there are 6 beads and 7 knots. Add one or 2 beads for an anklet.
- You can also use spacer beads instead of making knots between each bead, for a different look (see below instructions)
- Cut the fabric 2 ½" (6 cm) from the last bead using scissors (ask an adult assistance to use the scissors.)
- Wrap the bracelet around your wrist and knot the two ends.

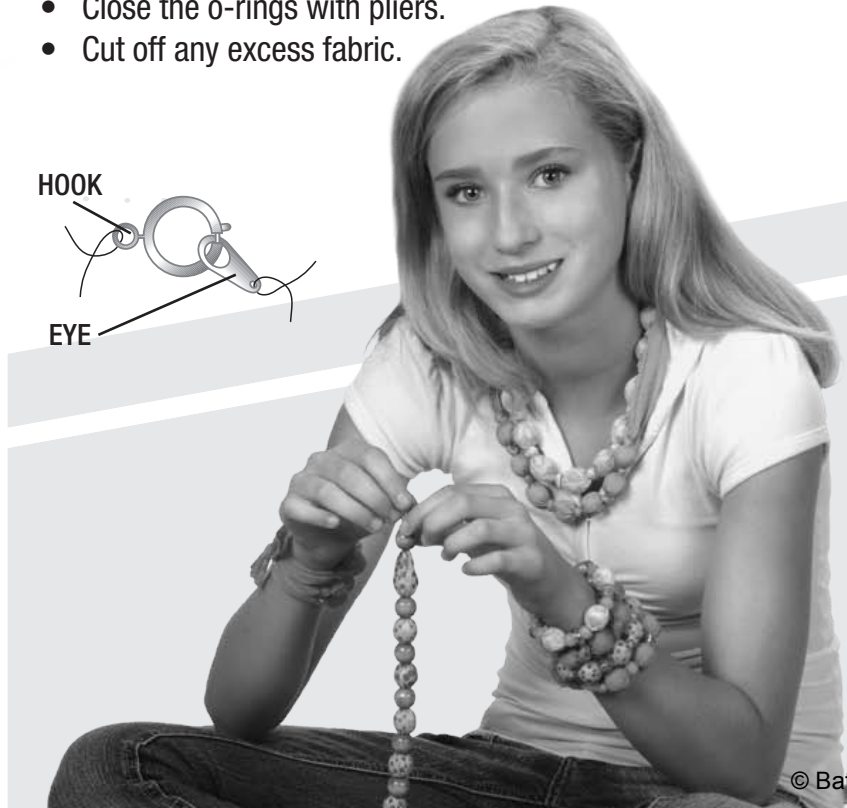
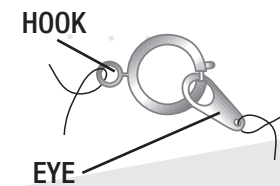
BEAD WRAPS



To attach a clasp:

- Insert one end of the fabric tube through a metal o-ring before you make your first knot.
- Make a knot around the o-ring making sure the o-ring is outside the knot.

- Add the beads and knots or beads spacers.
- Insert the end of the fabric tube through another metal o-ring before you make your last knot.
- Carefully open each o-ring with pliers and insert each o-ring through the opening on the hook piece and the eye piece.
- Close the o-rings with pliers.
- Cut off any excess fabric.



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NECKLACE

To make a necklace:

- Choose one of the fabric tubes.
- Remove cardboard insert and cut both ends just after the seam.
- Make a knot 6 ½" (16 cm) from one end of the fabric tube.
- Slide a pink or blue bead into the open end of the tube and slide it all the way down to the knot.
- Pull the fabric tight over the bead and twist once. Make a tight knot after the bead or add a spacer bead.
- Continue adding beads and making knots until there are 7 beads and 8 knots.
- Cut the fabric 6 ½" (16 cm) from the last bead.
- You can attach a clasp or use both ends of the fabric tube to attach it with a knot.
- For a fully-beaded necklace, use 16 to 18 beads instead of 7 and only leave 2 ½" (6 cm) of fabric at both ends.

To use the small beads instead of making knots:

You can also use the smaller beads, like the purple rings, pink sparkles, turquoise pearls, the wooden beads, or mirror cubes instead of knots between each of the plastic beads.

* Roll the tip of the fabric tube as thin as possible and thread through the bead hole.

* Slide the small bead all the way down to squeeze the bigger bead inside the fabric tube

TRIPLE STRAND BRACELET

To make a triple strand bracelet:

- You will need to use a full length of a fabric tube and cut both ends just after the seam.
- Thread a small bead on to the fabric tube 6 ½" (16cm) from the edge.
- Slide a big plastic bead inside the fabric tube.
- Thread another small bead on the outside the tube.
- Position the 2 small beads as close as possible on both sides of the big bead.
- Thread another small bead 5 ¼" (13 cm) from the last small bead.
- Slide a second big plastic bead into the fabric tube followed by another small bead on the outside.
- Repeat those steps once more.
- Place the first row of beads on top of your wrist and wrap around your wrist twice. All the beads should line up. If not, slide the beads into line.
- Wrap the bracelet around your wrist and knot the two ends.

You can untie the knots to remove the beads and to create a new bracelet or necklace!
